Our employees are our **greatest asset**. We're proud of the way we provide vital frontline services every day and work together, as **one team**.

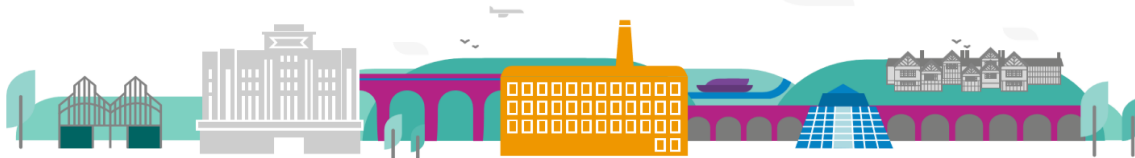
Our 4 **core values** as shown above, run through everything that we do, and we aim to stay **true** to them regardless of the challenges that we may face.

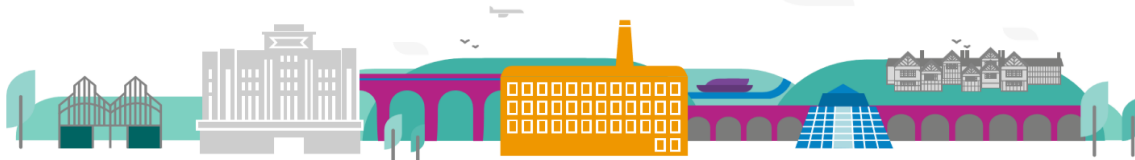

Main Purpose of the Job

You will be providing leadership and management, technical and professional expertise, making decisions and supporting others below your grade. You will be supported by senior managers at grades above you. You will be responsible for leading a Highway Design and Construction Team to design, procure and manage highways related projects. You will be providing technical advice to other teams within the council, to the Highway Design & Construction Manager and Head of Service. In addition, you will be working with other teams to ensure the Council's Capital Programme is managed in a transparent manner, providing information to support reports and decision making.

Key Responsibilities

- Contribute to the key aims and objectives of the organisation, both within the post holder's specific remit, across Capital Delivery, Strategic Infrastructure, Place, and the Council as a whole.
- Comply and ensure compliance with the Council's policies and procedures
- Work collaboratively across Capital Delivery, Strategic Infrastructure, Place, the Council, TFGM, GMCA and with other external partners, agents, and stakeholders to promote and deliver council objectives and maximise performance and operational efficiencies.
- Manage teams to design and construct specific physical improvement measures for a range of highways and transportation schemes of various types and sizes
- To establish, develop and maintain effective working relationships with internal and external partners.
- To work closely with all stakeholders, including the local community and the private sector in the development and delivery of key transportation projects.



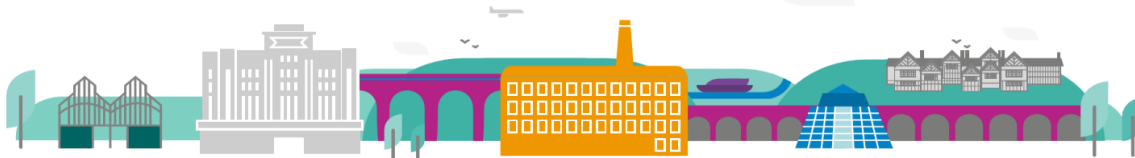
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- To develop and deliver transportation and highway related and other relevant infrastructure schemes throughout the borough and in collaboration with neighbouring authorities
- To keep the Highway Design & Construction Manager informed of risks, opportunities, performance and challenges about the delivery of the borough's projects.
- Manage change effectively, proactively identifying opportunities and working with colleagues/partners
- Contribute to issues relating to the Council's Resilience and Business Continuity, including representing the service as required during an incident.
- To monitor income and expenditure within allocated budgets highlighting areas of concern and proposing remedial actions.
- To assist in the recruitment, selection, discipline and development of staff.
- Work flexibly within the role and support general activities within Capital Delivery, Strategic Infrastructure, Place, and the Council.
- To work positively and inclusively with colleagues and customers so that the Council provides a workplace to deliver a service that does not discriminate against people on the grounds of their age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage, civil partnership, pregnancy, maternity, race, religion, belief, sex, or sexual orientation.
- To fulfil personal requirements, where appropriate, with regards to Council policies and procedures, standards of attendance, health, safety and welfare, customer care, emergency, evacuation, security and promotion of the Council's priorities.

- Experience of AutoCAD, associated design software and CAD standards within a busy drawing office environment to support highway design
- Commercial awareness and knowledge of the NEC suite of contracts, including frameworks, using various payment mechanisms.
- Strong management, negotiating, analytical and problem-solving skills, with the ability to interpret complex data, both text and numerical, whilst working to tight deadlines and operational targets.
- Working knowledge of Quality Assurance Systems and a commitment to quality service provision
- Excellent inter-personal skills and experience of effectively managing the work of other members of staff
- Ability to engage with a diverse range of stakeholders including political, professional, and public audiences using a variety of forms of communication.
- Experience of managing, coaching and mentoring for your team and others.
- HNC or similar/higher level qualification in a Civil Engineering related subject plus evidence of continuing professional development
- Membership of the Institution of Civil Engineers or equivalent would be desirable
