About New Park Academy

New Park Academy is part of The Sovereign Trust, joining the Trust in June 2018 alongside Manor Academy and Pictor Academy.

We are a specialist provision for pupils in Key Stages 2, 3, 4 and 5 (Years 3–13) who have been identified as having Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs, often alongside additional learning, communication or developmental challenges.

Many of our pupils arrive having experienced significant barriers to education. At New Park, we recognise that every young person's journey is unique. Our approach is rooted in a simple but powerful principle:

School should adapt to the needs of the child – not the other way around.

Our Approach

We pride ourselves on:

- Seeing each pupil as an individual
- Taking a flexible, creative and “out of the box” approach to education
- Building strong, trusting relationships as the foundation for learning
- Providing a safe, structured and nurturing environment

In addition to our school based offer, for pupils who find traditional school settings particularly challenging, we have developed a thriving EOTIS (Education Other Than In School) programme, offering personalised pathways to ensure continued engagement in education, that is facilitated through learning mentors within the community and/or on occasion within students homes.

Curriculum

New Park Academy offers a broad and balanced curriculum, carefully adapted to meet the needs of our pupils.

Learners are supported to achieve a wide range of **external qualifications**, from Entry Level through to GCSE, alongside developing key life and employability skills.

Our curriculum places particular emphasis on:

- Engagement and re-engagement with learning
- Practical and vocational pathways
- Personal development and independence
- Preparation for adulthood

Specialist Support

We take a holistic approach to supporting our pupils, recognising that learning cannot happen without emotional wellbeing.

Our staff team includes a high proportion trained in ELKLAN, enabling us to effectively support communication needs across the school.

We also provide a range of targeted interventions, including:

- Therapeutic play
- Therapeutic art

Teacher of Design & Technology (D&T) / Construction

Job Purpose

To deliver high-quality teaching and learning in Design & Technology and Construction to pupils with Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs.

To lead a safe, engaging and inclusive practical curriculum that supports pupils' academic achievement, personal development and preparation for adulthood.

Key Responsibilities

Teaching and Learning

- Plan and deliver high-quality lessons in D&T/Construction across KS3 and KS4
- Adapt teaching to meet SEMH and additional learning needs
- Create an engaging and structured learning environment
- Set high expectations for behaviour, engagement and achievement
- Use a range of teaching strategies to motivate reluctant learners
- Deliver accredited courses (e.g. BTEC/City & Guilds/GCSE where applicable)
- Provide high-quality feedback in line with school policy

Curriculum Leadership (D&T)

- Lead the development and delivery of the D&T/Construction curriculum
- Ensure curriculum intent, implementation and impact are clearly evidenced
- Maintain schemes of work, resources and assessment frameworks
- Promote practical, vocational and employability skills
- Contribute to whole-school curriculum development
- Support enrichment opportunities (e.g. projects, enterprise activities)
