- Plan and deliver high-quality, personalised Humanities (Geography and History) lessons tailored to pupils with complex SEND, including SEMH and Autism
- Deliver an ambitious, sequenced Humanities (Geography and History) curriculum, adapted to meet a wide range of needs and abilities
- Use a range of strategies to support engagement, including scaffolding, modelling, and structured interventions
- Embed communication approaches (e.g. visual supports, total communication) within teaching

#### Assessment, Monitoring and Progress

- Apply the principles of assessment, monitoring and evaluation to support pupil progress
- Use assessment data effectively to plan for sustained development across reading, writing and communication
- Track pupil progress against EHCP outcomes and curriculum expectations
